

RCI Class Action Proposed Settlement Information

The agreement

The terms of the proposed settlement are contained in a 37-page agreement with another 243 pages of exhibits. A short summary of the settlement terms is on-line at www.tstoday.com/rciclassaction. That website also includes a copy of the TimeSharing Today editorial suggesting changes to the proposed settlement agreement and numerous comments from subscribers, most of which objected to those terms of the agreement which give RCI a right to rent deposited weeks after a 45-day exclusive period for exchangers.

Certain nominal monetary benefits are available to RCI Weeks members if they submit a claim form., which is available on the above website **or by calling 866-783-5876**. Filing a claim for the monetary benefits does not preclude you from filing an objection to the settlement.

Objecting to the settlement

If you're a Class member, you can object to the settlement if you don't like any part of it. You should give reasons

why you think the Court should not approve it.

To object, you must send a letter saying that you object to the settlement in this case: **In re: Resort Condominiums International, LLC, Civil Action No. 06-1222 (PGS)**.

Be sure to include the your name, address, telephone number, Resort Identification Number, resort name and your signature, and the reasons you object to the settlement. Mail the objection to these places **postmarked no later than November 20, 2009** to:

Opting out of the settlement

Opting out of the settlement is telling the Court that you don't want to be part of the Class. If you exclude yourself, you have no basis to object because the case no longer affects you. If the settlement is approved, you would not be bound by its terms and would have the right to bring your own lawsuit. You cannot file an objection to the settlement if you exclude yourself.

To exclude yourself from the settlement, you must send a letter by mail saying that you want to be excluded from In re: Resort Condominiums International, LLC, Civil Action No. 06-1222 (PGS). Be sure to include your program identification number, your name, address and telephone number. You must mail your exclusion request **postmarked no later than November 20, 2009** to:

Speaking at the hearing

You may ask the Court for permission to speak at the Fairness Hearing. To do so, you must send a letter saying that it is your "Notice of Intention to Appear in In re: Resort Condominium International, LLC, Civil Action No. 06-1222 (PGS)." Be sure to include your name, address, telephone number, and your signature. Your notice of Intention to appear must be **postmarked no later than November 20, 2009** and be sent to the Clerk of the Court, and the same attorneys listed in the column to the left.

The final settlement hearing will be held November 30, 2009 at 2:30 pm.

What should you do?

Excluding yourself from the settlement gives you the right to bring your own claims against RCI if you believe the company has violated your rights as a member. If you do not anticipate doing that, there is not much reason to exclude yourself, especially if you disagree with the terms of the settlement.

If you do not exclude yourself, you should consider filing a claim for the monetary benefits, even though you may not consider them significant. If you file a claim, you can still file an objection.

If you are satisfied with the terms of the settlement, you need do nothing. However, you can notify the court that you would like the settlement to be approved.

If you don't like the settlement terms and have not excluded yourself, you can file an objection with the court and the attorneys. If many members object, that is likely to influence the Judge's view as to whether he should approve the settlement.

You need to make your own decision of the best course of action for you.

TimeSharing Today's editorial (on-line at www.tstoday.com/rciclassaction) said that the agreement should be approved only if the provisions concerning RCI's rental rights were modified and the agreement continued in force for more than two years. The Publisher appeared at the Fairness hearing in August to oppose approval.
